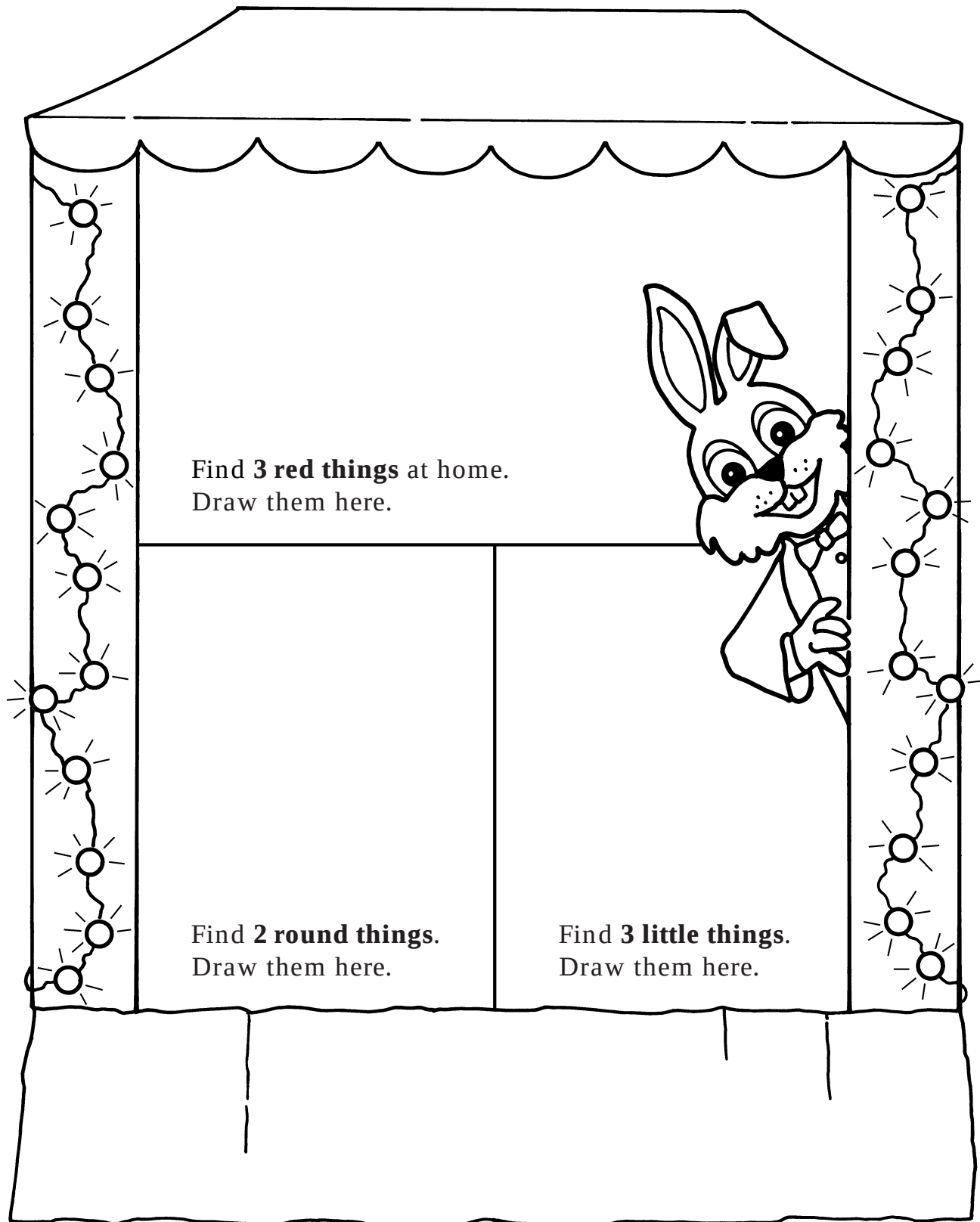

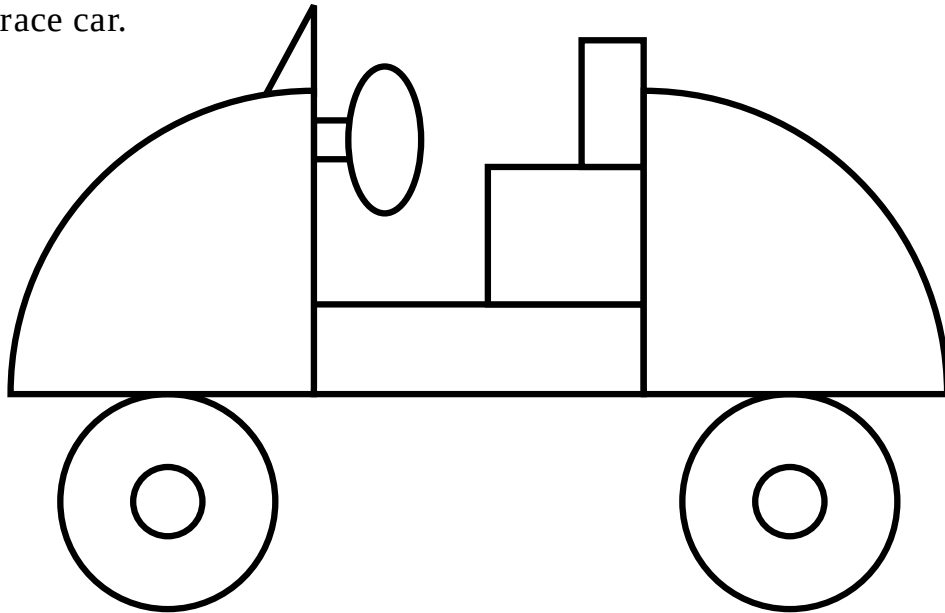

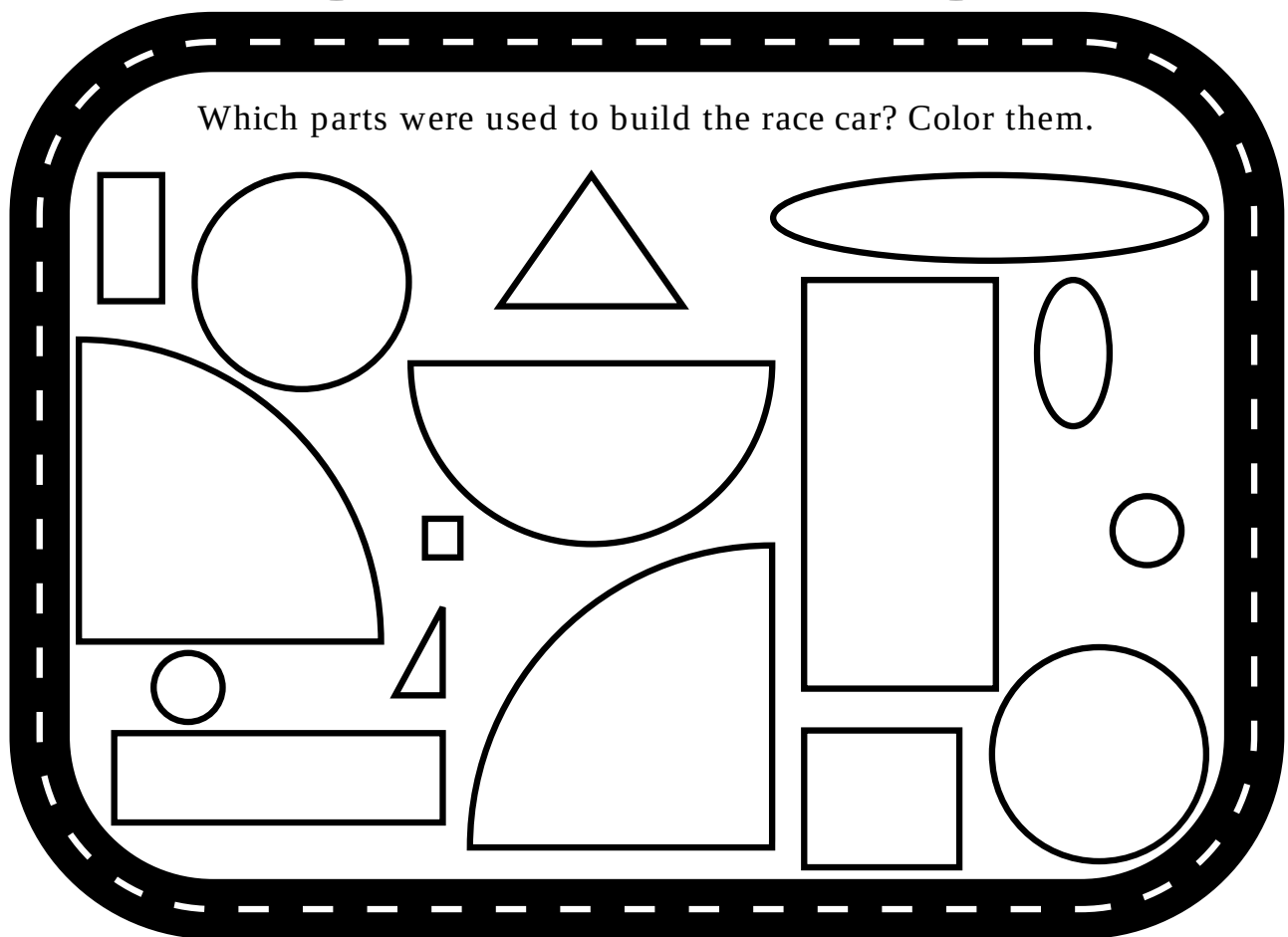


Which Parts?

Which parts were used to build the race car? Color them.

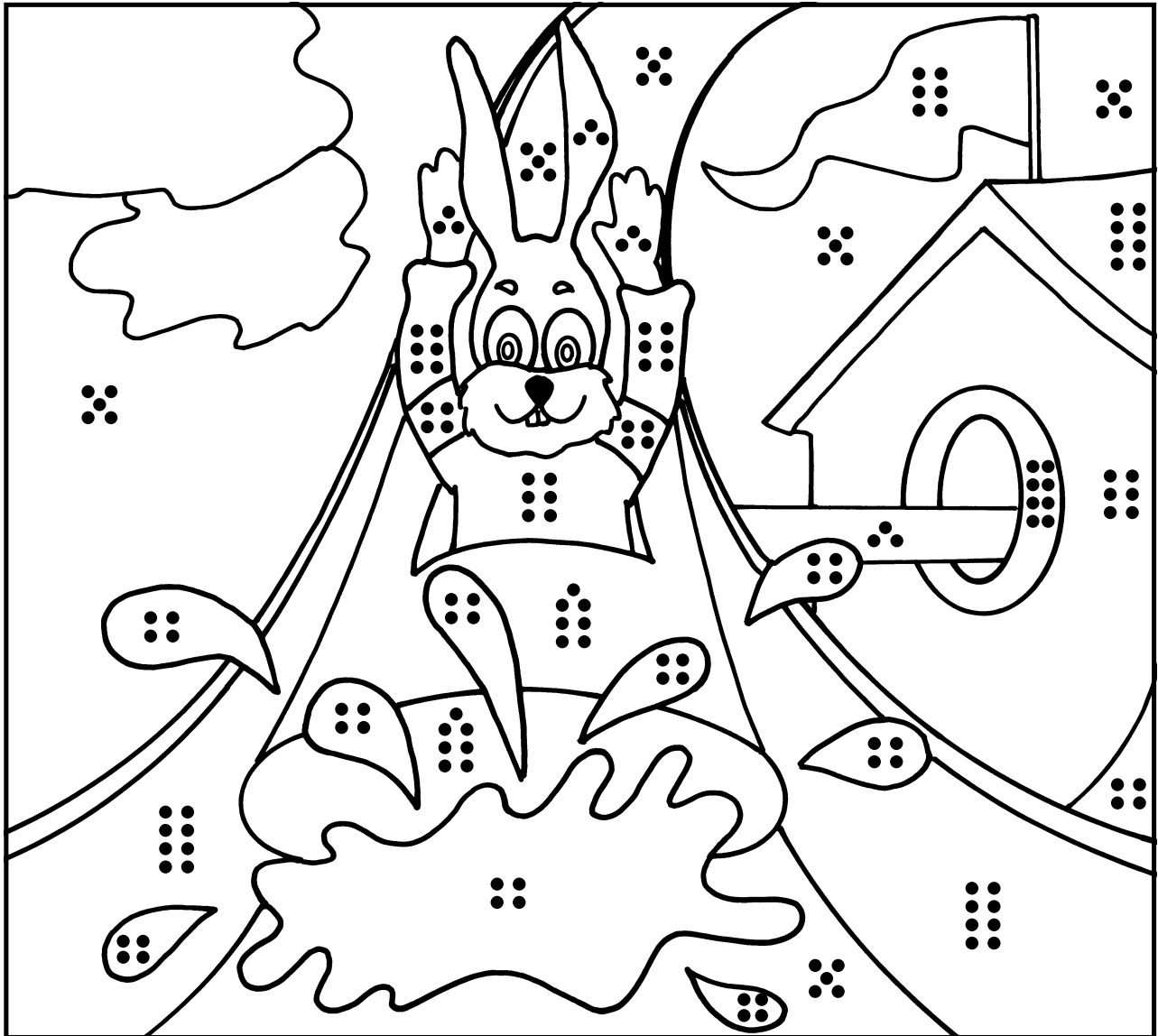


Tips for grown-ups: On another printout, have your child color and cut out **all** of the parts and arrange them to create a different picture.

Log Ride

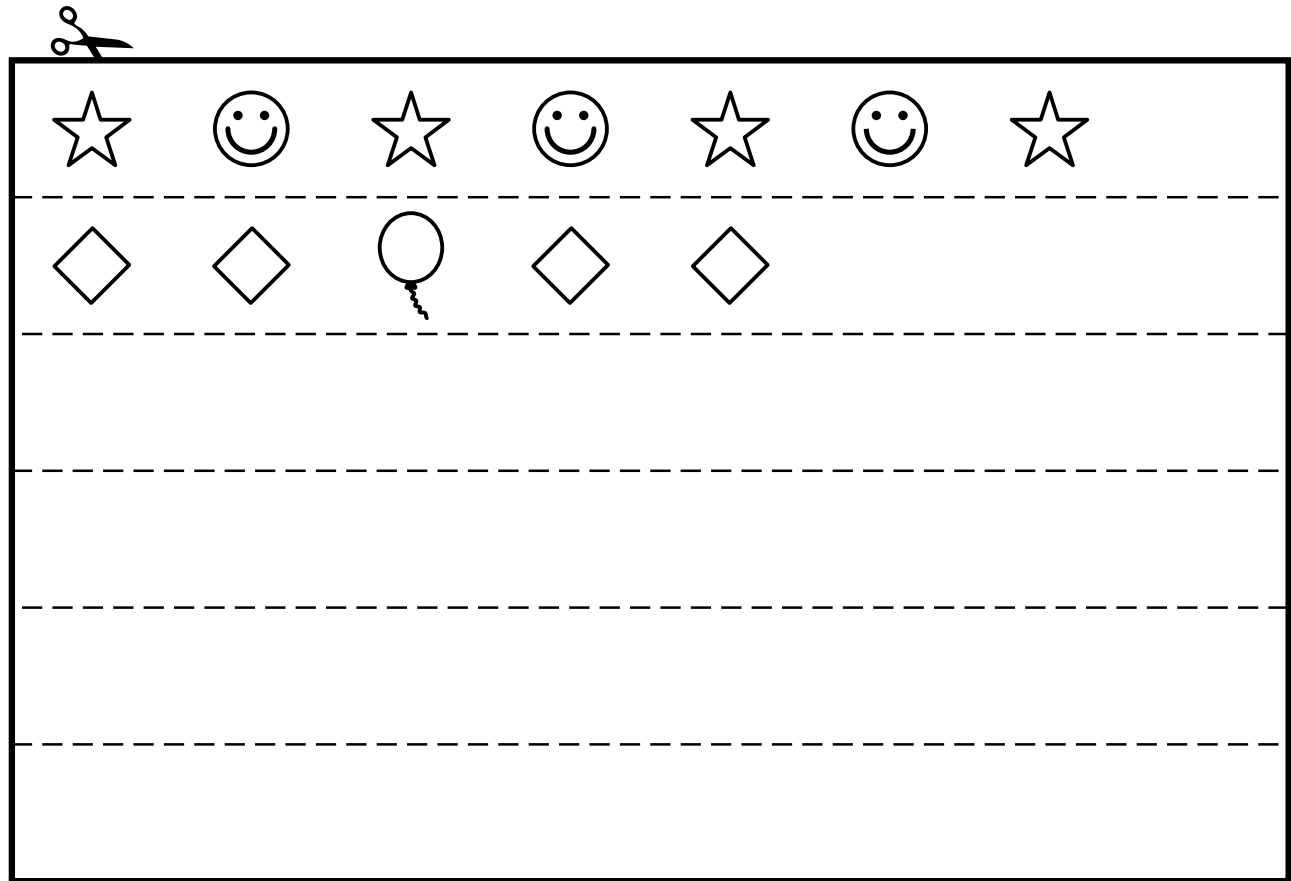
Count the dots and color.

- 8 purple



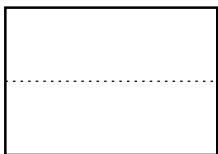
Tips for grown-ups: To vary the activity on another day, change the coloring key so that the resulting picture is colored in a new palette.

Patterned Paper

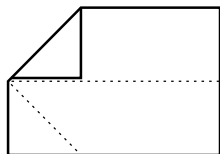


1. Look at the first row. Draw what comes next.

3. Make your own patterns in the other rows.

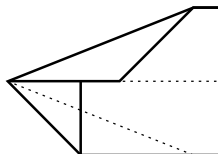
Tips for grown-ups: Help your child fold the patterned paper into a paper airplane. For additional planes, print the page again and have your child draw different repeat patterns in different colors.

again.



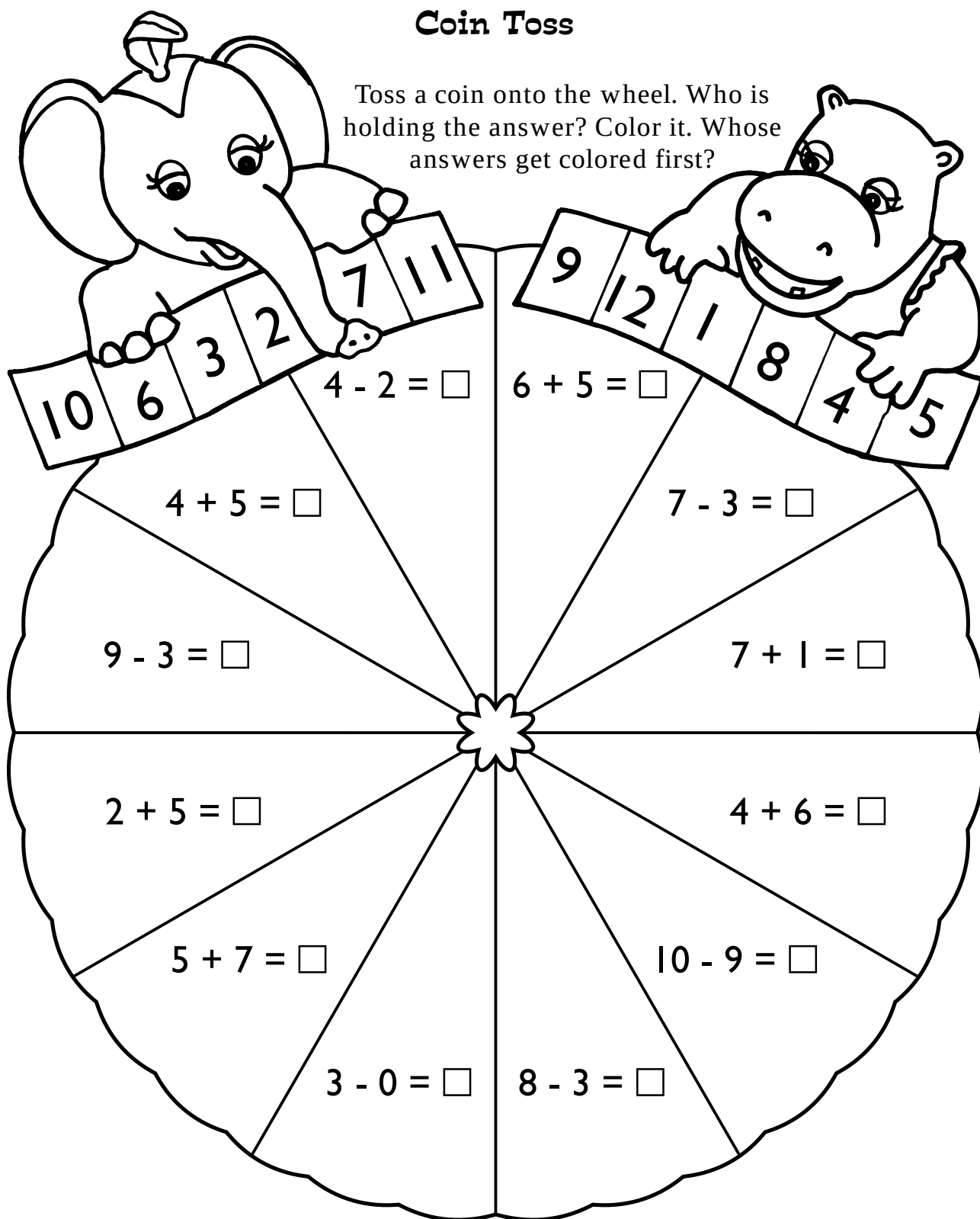
Fold in half.

Coin Toss

Toss a coin onto the wheel. Who is holding the answer? Color it. Whose answers get colored first?



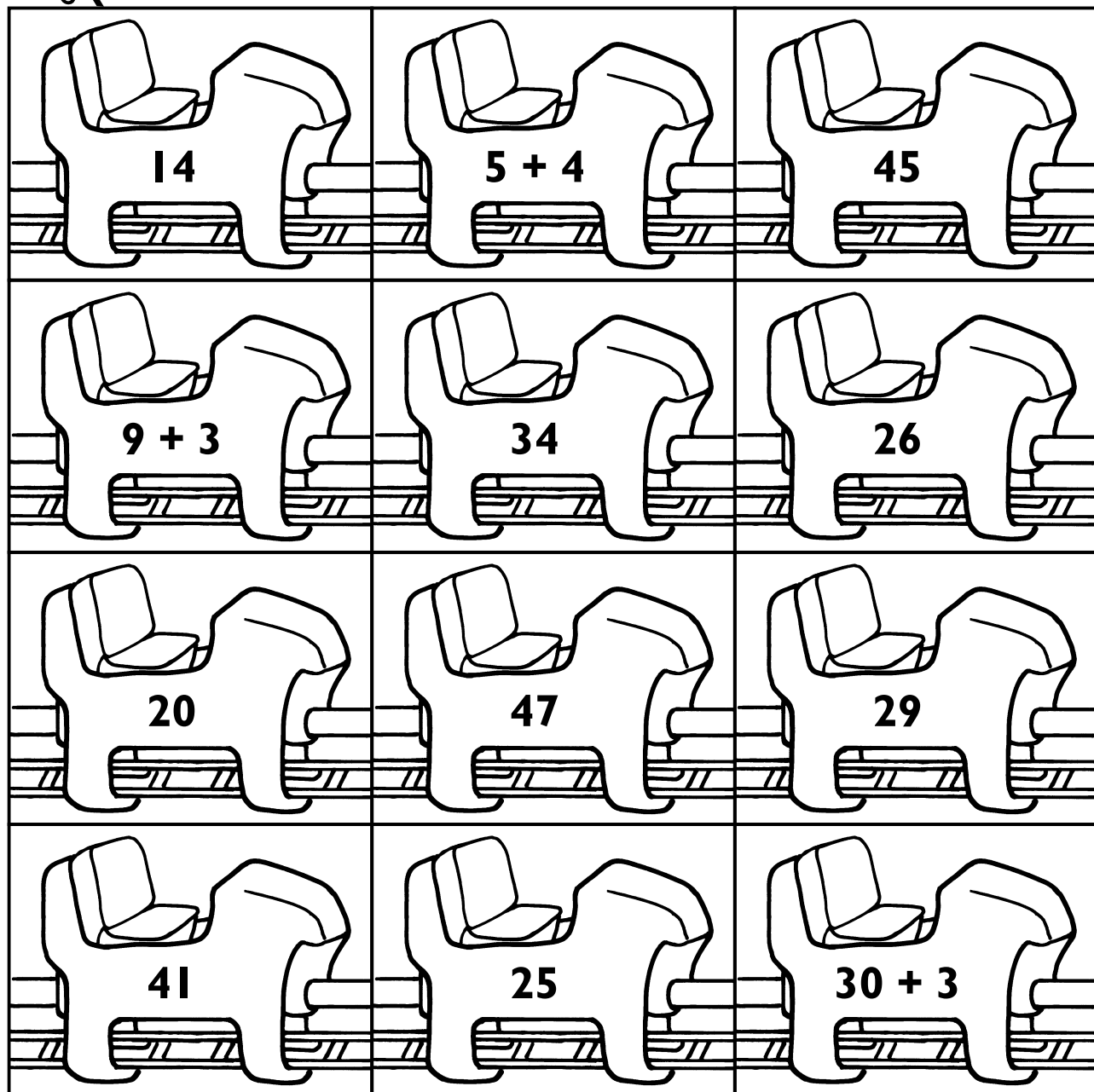
Tips for grown-ups: To play with two players, make a new printout. One player is Elephant; the other is Hippo. Take turns. Toss the coin, and color the answer only if it is held by your character. **Supervise play with small objects such as coins.**

Roller Coaster Ride (Game for Two)

Cut out the cars. Put them in a paper bag. To play:

- ☆ Each player draws a car out of the bag.
- ☆ The player with the higher number gets both cars.

Who builds the longest roller coaster by the end of the game?



Tips for grown-ups: To build longer roller coasters, print out multiple pages. To vary the game, play for the **lowest** number.
